Dear Philip,

Thank you very much for your last letter. I'm very glad that you wrote to me in English, and I can answer you directly and know something about the Movement in Brazil. I hope that by now you have met Dov Zamir, and I also hope he has reported to you about our last meeting.

SHLICHIM - Because of three reasons which I am indicating below, I see Moshe Frankel's going very nebulous:-

- a) Bror Chayil has only released him from the end of December.
- b) A Daf Keshet which you sent to Bror Chayil complaining about Moshe Frankel's and Chico's mishandling of the Shnat Sherut (Moshe claims that if his name is blackened before he comes so much, why should he come at all?)
- c) His girl-friend Jeanette because of delays in releasing him from Bror Chayil has decided to stay and study in Tel Aviv.

I am very angry, and so should you be too, and I hope you'll send a strong letter to everyone concerned. The matter is coming up this week to the Mazkirut in Bror Chayil, and I will let you know the results.

SHNAT HACHSHARAH - I personally agree with you that Shnat Hachsharah should take place in an Israeli Kibbutz. I would like them to stay there all the time, but we're even prepared to accept the idea that the last 5 months should be in Bror Chayil. I would like confirmation from you as to how many people will come, their ages, sexes, and a questionnaire regarding every one of them (this is done in the American Movement) so we'll be able to follow the development of each individual, their exact date of arrival, and the exact date of termination. After receiving your letter, we will send you the name of the Meshek, and the exact programme covering the whole period. It's obvious that this Workshop is the entire responsibility of the Mazkirut Olamit providing one small thing, and that is if Bror Chayil is prepared to accept our tutelage.
