The Academic Record on the reverse side of this page constitutes an official document, if authenticated with the stamp of the issuing Faculty/School and the signature of the certifying Faculty/School official. Grades from the student's last year of studies which have not yet been computerized may be typed in by the issuing Faculty/School.

Courses are arranged according to level (undergraduate, graduate, etc.). Departmental studies appear first and are followed by complementary courses (foreign language(s), extra-departmental studies, etc.). Final degree grades are listed at the end of the Record.

Additional Studies are courses for which the student was not officially registered.

Surplus studies: Courses in addition to degree requirements.

The academic year at the Hebrew University is divided into three trimesters. The number of weekly hours cited for each course expresses its value in weekly hours on a yearly basis (e.g., a course which meets three hours per week during one trimester will be listed as one weekly hour.)

In the Faculty of Agriculture and in the School for Overseas Students the academic year is divided into semesters; thus hours per week cited are for one semester's duration.

Course Number

The first two digits in the course number signify the department / area of studies offering the course. See the departmental code in column 4.

Grades followed by an asterisk are based on a retest.

Grading System

The notation "failing" appears for grades below 50; in the Faculty of Natural Sciences for grades below 30.

Explanation of Verbal Grades

Exemp - The student is exempt from the course on the basis of examination, or has received course credit on the basis of previous studies outside the Hebrew University.

Act P - The student participated in the course without being required to take an examination.

SP - The grade was given on the basis of a seminar paper.

PS - The grade was given on the basis of a pro-seminar paper.

W - The student was granted permission to withdraw.

WF - Withdrew for non-academic reasons.

IP - In progress - The student registered, final grade has not been submitted.

Pass - The student received a passing grade for a course having only Pass and Fail grades.

Success - The student completed the course successfully.

Excel - The student completed the course excellently.
